The Johnson City MTPO Executive Board and Executive Staff met on November 8, 2023 in Johnson City and approved one amendment to the Johnson City MTPO Fiscal Year 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). **Amendment 2 (Resolution 2023-06)** amends the TIP to add \$1,700,000 (\$1,360,000 Federal and \$340,000 Local) in STBG-L funds and move phases to Fiscal Year 2024, along with revising the scope to add adjacent intersections.

During the public comment period from October 25 to November 7, 2023, there were no comments received. The Johnson City MTPO followed all federal guidelines and public participation policies set forth in the Johnson City MTPO Public Participation Plan.

A signed **Self-Certification (Resolution 2023-05)** was also passed at the same Executive Board meeting and is enclosed with this letter. The TIP was reviewed by TDOT and MTPO staff and is found to be fiscally constrained. The following is a summary of Amendment 2 to the FY 2023-2026 TIP.

Amendment 2: Amended STBG-L Project - Old Gray Station Road Section 2 at SR 75 Traffic Signal





Hi Mary,

We have determined that the length of the project is 1.328 miles. The portion of the project on Bobby Hicks Highway is 0.93 miles and the portion of the project on Old Gray Station Road from the intersection of Bobby Hicks Highway to the intersection of Buckingham Road is 0.279 miles. This leaves only .041 miles for the portion of the project on Old Gray Station Road running north of Bobby Hicks Highway, and it was determined this area is 0.119 miles. Therefore, I believe this amendment will have to be resubmitted before we can give concurrence. Additionally, as a reminder an ITS checklist will have to be submitted for this project. Thank you for your patience.
